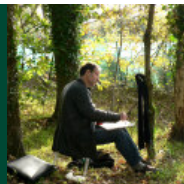

### ADULT PROGRAMS

#### **Art Talk: Conversations with Artists, Curators & Collectors**

#### **Gallery Talk with Denis Clavreul**

Saturday, September 22—1-2 pm

Visiting from France, Denis Clavreul will present a gallery talk on his exhibit; *In Audubon's Footsteps*. A renowned watercolor painter and PhD ecologist, he will share insight into his work and inspirations. \$5 M/\$8 NM

#### **Sketching and Painting in Watercolors**

Saturday, September 22—2-5 pm

Denis Clavreul will demonstrate his techniques for capturing nature in pencil and watercolors. After a brief introduction to technique students will work outside on their own sketches and watercolors. All levels welcome. \$24 M/\$32 NM

#### **Drawing Birds with Catherine Hamilton**

Sunday, October 7—1-4 pm and Sunday, October 14—1-4 pm

In the first class of this two-session workshop, we will learn to draw birds by working up close with mounted specimens. In the second session, we will work outside on the wildlife sanctuary. Students will develop their skills through drawing exercises and observing demonstrations. Drawings from Mass Audubon's art collection will be on display for inspiration and discussion. #### **Barry Van Dusen: Painting the Natural Landscape**

Each day we will venture outdoors to learn about plants and animals in winter through art projects, games and nature hikes. Friday's session will conclude with an art show for family and friends.

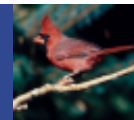
